MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL

The Mayor and City Council of the City of St. Martinville, Louisiana met in Regular Session on the 21st day of October 2024 at City Hall, their regular meeting place, pursuant to the

call of the Mayor.

Mayor Jason Willis presiding called the meeting to order.

Due to the absence of Lorrie M Poirier, Candy Bertrand substituted as Clerk of the Council.

It was moved by Janise Anthony duly seconded by Flo Chatman and unanimously carried that the minutes of the regular meeting held October 7, 2024 hereby be approved for publication in the Teche News, the Official Journal of the City of St. Martinville.

It was moved by Carol Frederick duly seconded by Mike Fuselier that Accounting Specialist Katy Bujard be appointed as interim CFO to replace Avis Gutekunst with a 34% pay increase until someone is hired or Ms Bujard officially applies and is appointed to the position.

A substitute motion was made by Jonas Fontenette duly seconded by Flo Chatman that Accounting Specialist Katy Bujard be appointed as interim CFO to replace Avis Gutekunst with a pay increase from \$19.39/hr to \$30.59/hr.

It was moved by Carol Frederick duly seconded by Flo Chatman and unanimously carried that Mayor Willis be authorized to sign a contract for engineering services for drainage improvements of Durand Drainage Phase II Planning & Design(50-MQ5-20-1) contingent upon receipt of an email from McBade Engineering to charge the City for only work that is performed as a result of the scope of work being reduced.

It was moved by Flo Chatman duly seconded by Janise Anthony that Mayor Willis be authorized to sign renewal of contract with La Louisianne for two years. The writing and administration of grants will also be included in the contract.

A substitute motion was made by Mike Fuselier duly seconded by Carol Frederick that Mayor Willis be authorized to sign renewal of contract with La Louisianne for one year.

Upon request of Eric Martin to hold a BBQ benefit for Blake Douet on Sunday, February 9<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am until 12:00 noon, it was moved by Mike Fuselier duly seconded by Carol Frederick and unanimously carried that permission be granted for the use of the Pavilion in Magnolia Park. Councilman Fuselier and City Attorney Allan Durand will split the cost of the rental for the pavilion.

Upon request of Mayor Willis, it was moved by Mike Fuselier duly seconded by Carol Frederick and unanimously carried that Mr George Choplin be granted permission to organize the Annual Christmas Parade sponsored by the City to be held Sunday, December 8<sup>th</sup>. The parade will be held annually on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of December for the remainder of this term. The mayor stated that he is not recommending the City host any other parade, only the annual Christmas Parade. An entrance fee will be charged for parade participants. The entrance fee funds will pay for security. The theme for this year's parade is A Cajun Creole Christmas in the Ville.

Delana Owens request for a variance to obtain a liquor license in the vicinity of a church was removed from the agenda due to the location not being within 300 feet from a church.

Following requests of Pharmacists David Dorcey, Ji Sonnier, and Michael Moresi, it was moved by Mike Fuselier and unanimously seconded that the City withdraw from the Opioid Lawsuit against Louisiana Wholesale Drugs.

Upon request of Councilman Jonas Fontenette, it was moved by Mike Fuselier duly seconded by Janise Anthony and unanimously carried that a request by Notre Dame Church for a Special Event permit to sell alcohol be added to the agenda of this meeting.

It was moved by Jansie Anthony duly seconded by Mike Fuselier and unanimously carried that the hiring of Avis Gutekunst as CFO Consultant be added to the agenda of this meeting.

It was moved by Mike Fuselier duly seconded by Carol Frederick and unanimously carried that the appointment of three Planning & Zoning Commission members be added to the agenda of this meeting.

Councilwoman Flo Chatman tabled her agenda item to discuss term limits for the City Council that were approved during the last administration.

It was moved by Jonas Fontenette duly seconded by Janise Anthony and unanimously carried that a Public Hearing be opened for the La Economic Development Restoration Tax Abatement requested by Michael Leblanc of Duchamp Opera House.

SMEDA Director Jennifer Stelly explained the tax abatement through the State would only abate property taxes for all new investments/improvement he has made following the purchase of the property.

It was moved by Mike Fuselier duly seconded by Carol Frederick and unanimously carried that a Public Hearing be closed for the La Economic Development Restoration Tax Abatement requested by Michael Leblanc of Duchamp Opera House.

It was moved by Mike Fuselier duly seconded by Carol Frederick and unanimously carried that the La Economic Development Restoration Tax Abatement requested by Michael Leblanc of Duchamp Opera House be approved.

It was moved by Mike Fuselier duly seconded by Flo Chatman and unanimously carried that City Attorney prepare a resolution to the State to object that the municipality pay expenses related to Tax Abatement.
